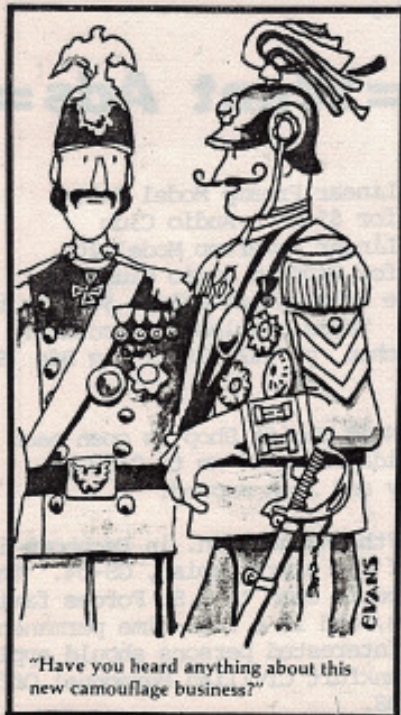

Sound like anybody you know? I hope not. Safeguarding government property is a heavy responsibility. Here's some tips from a sadder but wiser ole hand. Before you sign for it, know what it is your signing for. You may not have seen an AN/TFC-110 since your last nightmare. Does it come with a carrying case? What components make up a complete AN/TFC-110? Touch it, feel it, kick it... Make sure all of it is really there. Don't accept a DA Form 2407 receipt for the item without personally checking the support shop for the item

by serial number. And while you're there, find out when it is going to be fixed. Maybe it's being classified out because of negligence or abuse and you could end up report of surveying the property as soon as it's officially yours.

Know where it is at all times. That's why sensitive items are inventoried every 30 days. Some really sensitive items are inventoried at shift change. When in doubt, ask. Call or drop by your friendly S4 shop. Ask your PBO (Property Book Officer), he knows.
